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

Think about how we could look after the place where the polar bear lives. Draw a picture and write a message about how you could take care of the area that the polar bear lives in.	In the story, the Gruffalo is described as having lots of scary features such as sharp claws, a terrible jaw, a poisonous wart on his nose and purple spikes on his back. Can you draw a picture of the Gruffalo and label his scary features? You might want to ask a family member to help you label your picture. You read a story and drew a picture about <i>The Gruffalo</i> . Think about the terrible jaw. Write the letter j on a piece of paper. Draw pictures of other things that start with the same sound. Not all places suit everyone and the white bear had to look for a place that was special for him. Think about your favourite place at school. Is it the classroom? Playground? Library? Tell a family member why this is your favourite place. Draw a picture of your favourite place. 
