Money Project Business Business

You are in charge of a very special place. You have decided that you want to open your own clothes shop but it's a big job and you must do all the planning and creative parts for your business. You will have to do the following tasks so that you are ready to launch your very exciting business.



Task 1:

Your first task is to officially start your business. You first need to decide on a name for your shop. You need to have a very good name that you really like. Try and make it as creative as you can. Every business needs an amazing logo. Once you have chosen a name, now you need to design a logo for your business. Draw your logo on a piece of paper, make it as creative and colourful as you can. Remember that logos should show what your business is called and should represent you.

A logo is a picture that shows what your shop is all about, for example KFC has a logo that is in the shape of a bucket of chicken \rightarrow

Task 2:

Now that you have named your business and created a logo you need to put on your items that your business is going to sell to everyone. You will need to pick 3 of the items that you will sell in your business. There are templates of the things that you can sell in your shop below. You need to pick 3 items that you are going to sell and you will need to draw your logo on each of the items so that they are ready to be sold.

Once you have chosen your items and put your fantastic design on them, you then need to decide how much you are going to sell them for. When you decide to sell something, you have to add more money to the cost price so that you make a profit for your business. For your store you need to look at the cost price and find half of the cost price and add it. I have put an example below for you.

EXAMPLE:

- Cost price of making a scarf is \$10
- I need to find half of \$10 which is \$5
- Next I need to add the two together \$10 + \$5 = \$15
- So I will sell the scarf for \$15 and I will be making \$5 as my profit every time I sell one scarf.
- I have included a table on the next page for you to fill in with all your information for your business.

Item	Cost Price	Working out	Final Price
Miss Abrego's Scarf	\$10	\$10 + \$5 =	\$15

Task 3: (Have a go and do as much as you can, the problems get harder and harder)

You have some scenarios in the table below. You need to carefully read the scenarios that have happened in your business. You will need to think mathematically to solve the scenarios.

Scenario 1: A customer walked into your shop and they had \$150 to spend. They want to spend all their money in your shop. Write what items they could buy and how many of each item they can buy with their money. Make sure to show your working out.	
Scenario 2: Mrs Abel came into your store today and she was very excited, she had \$560 to spend in your store. She wants to buy as much as she can of each of your items. Can you please work out how many of your items Mrs Abel can buy today?	
Scenario 3 You are very lucky, Mr Price discovered that you own a shop that sells clothes and he wants to buy all the teachers matching outfits from your store. He has \$1000 to spend. Can you work out how many of your items from your store he can buy with his money. Remember he is buying one of each item for the teachers so there needs to be the same number of each item.	

Task 4:

Since your business is so successful, I want you to think about ways of making the most of your products. Have a look at the questions below and answer as many of them as you can.

- 1. Which item would you need to sell the most to make \$1000? Why?
- 2. Which item would raise the most funds, based on cost and quantity sold? How do you know?
- 3. Which item do you predict would be most popular with customers? Why?
- 4. What would you do to make people come to your shop?
- 5. What is something you like about creating your own shop?
- 6. Would you start your own business in real life? Why or why not?

Task 5:

Now that we have done all the other important tasks for your exciting new business, you now need to be creative again. Your job now is to make posters and advertisements telling people about your clothes and making them want to buy lots of new items from your shop. You can be as creative as you like, you could do an ad to appear in the newspaper or magazines, you could create a commercial for TV or radio. Have a go!
